


HOOPLA



What is HOOPLA?

Hoopla is a library services that gives access to Digital Music, Movies, Audiobooks, and Television episodes.

Borrowing Rules

- **Must have a valid library card and be a resident of Pueblo County.**
- **Allowed 10 checkouts per month. If checkouts are not used within a month, they do not roll over to the next month.**

ACCESS ON THE WEB

To access Hoopla, open a web browser. Hoopla runs the best on either Mozilla Firefox or Google Chrome. In the web address or URL bar, type in www.hoopladigital.com





CREATE AN ACCOUNT WITH HOOPLA


To create an account, select “Sign Up.”




Scroll to the bottom and “agree” to the terms of service.




Enter your e-mail address and create a password. Your e-mail will be your login.




Register with your Pueblo City-County Library District card number and PIN.




Select “Choose a library” and scroll down until you find Pueblo City-County Library District.




Next enter your PCCLD library card number (without spaces) and your pin (Normally, 8 digit birth date mmddyyyy, unless created otherwise.).



SEARCHING, BORROWING, AND RETURNING



In the Search box, enter a title, author, musician, or keyword. If you would like to browse categories, select from music, Movies, Audiobooks or Television.



For example, I searched the documentary film maker, Ken Burns.



Results for my search, returned 17 items associated with Ken Burns.




Double click on the cover of the item you would like to select.

To check-out the material select borrow.



After the item is checked out to you, you will be able to stream the film. After you are finished, you can return the item or wait for it to expire.




STREAMING

All titles and formats are available for streaming through a WiFi or internet connection.

DOWNLOADING

Some titles and formats are available to download through the Hoopla App on a device such as a tablet or smart phone. Most Android and iOS Apple devices are compatible with Hoopla.

Inside the Hoopla App for iOS Apple, there is a button  indicating that your device can download the documentary to my device for viewing without a WiFi signal. Depending on your device, the download symbol may look differently.
